Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you so much for attending our meet and greet parent teacher interviews last week. It is so nice to be able to form such strong partnerships with our families that benefit our children!

We had our very first Tarneit Rise Primary School photos today – which included promotional photos of the school and a whole school photo that I'm sure we will look back at over the years to come and remember fondly our foundation year!

We are also running a '**parent helpers**' course tomorrow so we can prepare parents and carers to help in the classroom, or further support their child's learning at home. We look forward to speeding this time with you.

We have started to include a few **extracurricular** events in the school calendar:

- a puppet show for the children on March 16 run by Camp Quality,
- Harmony Day on March 21
- AFL clinics for the preps March 8 and 15
- after school cricket

Our preps started school fulltime this week and are doing a great job. It has been so lovely to see the way they have settled into school, the routines, expectations and it has been wonderful to see the amazing learning gains they are already showing. Walking through the learning pods each day, we can see the consistent teaching right across the prep and 1/2 classes. The PLCs have started their PLC planning cycles, using pre- assessment data to plan for the learning of every child, and to monitor their progress. We are very proud of our staff and their high levels of teaching and team work!

With the cooler mornings approaching we have been noticing some students arriving out of uniform. **We are so very proud of our school and our uniform unites us as one community.** Please ensure your child is in the correct school uniform and wearing the right combination of uniform items:

#### **Sports Uniform**

- Windcheater (black and teal with logo)
- Black track pants/black shorts/skorts
- Black and teal polo top (long or short sleeved)
- White or black socks with runners (black if possible)

#### **Academic uniform**

- White striped shirt with logo (long or short sleeved)
- Grey pants (please note the grey pants are not track pants and are dark grey)
- Black pullover (jumper) with logo
- Black cardigan with logo
- Tunic (summer/winter)
- White or black socks with black shoes

The soft shelled jacket may be worn with either the spots or academic uniform. A black hat with the logo must be worn in terms 1 and 4. Please remember to clearly name all items of school uniform.

Over the past couple of weeks we have had parents and concerned community members come to see us worried about the safety of some of our students when travelling to and from school. While on yard duty it is very insightful to actually stand at our crossing for 10 minutes of an afternoon and observe the traffic. The traffic volume and the number of students crossing the road are both large. We encourage students and drivers to be patient and to obey all directions from the crossing attendant. The attendant has a particularly hectic job to do and needs our co-operation. ALL students and parents/carers should be using the school crossing in Rifflebird Road to cross safely or park in the car park at the sports pavilion in Hummingbird Boulevard and use the pedestrian path to enter school alongside the gymnasium. Please do not park in the staff car park. Children need to dismount from their bikes/scooters and walk across the crossing rather than ride their bikes across so cars are better able to see them. We ask that children do not ride their bikes or scooters inside the school yard as it is quite busy and crowded.

**It's Not Okay to Be Away** It is vital that students come to school every day so their academic and social skills can develop. It is a real worry to see any student missing more than 12 days of school over the year, but particularly for children in their early formative years. If a child is sick then home is the best place for them, otherwise **ALL** children should be at school **EVERY DAY**. Please remember, **it's not okay to be away**

The note that went home this week explained that it is important that students reading folders are brought to school every day and their reading logs are completed every night. ## Grade 1/2

Grade 1/2 students looked fantastic in their first Tarneit Rise school photo. We are proud of the way the grade 1/2 students are taking on the role of leadership and modelling the behaviours expected at our school. In reading and writing, students have been working on blending and segmenting words. It is great to see students finger spelling to help them write words. This term we are continuing to focus on the writing genre of recounts. This week in numeracy students have been learning to read, write and order numbers. Please ensure that your child is reading every night and that you are together completing the reading log. We hope that all students reach 25 nights as quickly as possible, however, it must be logged in the book.
