## School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus provides a one-off \$400 payment to help families cover the costs of their child's school uniforms, excursions and activities. Families will be able to access the School Saving Bonus via an online system from November 2024 and are able to use the funds towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- Excursions and Incursions
- Swimming and Sporting Programs
- Graduations
- School Uniform

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of each Victorian Government School student from Prep-Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home-schooled students, and TAFE students. There is no application required, the Department of Education will contact families directly with access to the online portal.

Unfortunately, the School Saving Bonus **cannot** be used towards 2025 Curriculum Contributions.

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions	Other Contributions	Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.	Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.	Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
