Student Led Conferences

We thank all families for prioritising time to attend our student led conferences this week. We are so incredibly proud of our children and their achievements. Working together with families ensures our children have the BEST opportunity for growth and maximising their learning outcomes. Did you know, research tells us the influence of parents and carers is among the most impactful in determining student achievement? John Hattie's meta-analyses show a high effect size for parental involvement in school. What makes a really big difference in achievement is when parents establish and communicate high expectations for their children. When these high expectations are shared between home and school, children benefit even more. To become partners in our children's education, we first have to build a relationship by connecting with each other, such as through our 'meet and greet' interviews in term one, and the student led conferences in term three. Our partnerships grow stronger, and expectations of (individual) student learning grows clearer each time we meet.

Thank you to everyone for your continued support of our school and your children. We cannot do what we do without you.

Up and Coming Events

We have lots of things to look forward to this term including many PLC excursions, Bastille Day, Book Week and Science Week celebrations.

On July 26th we are celebrating Bastille Day. There will be lots of fun, activities and performances on this day. We would like all children to come to school dressed in either red, blue or white on this day and children need to pay \$12 for the performance incursion which includes a delicious croissant snack. A separate note has been sent out on Compass with more details.

During Book Week there will be a lot of whole school activities including a whole school assembly on Friday 27th of August where children come to school dressed up as a book character. This will also be an open morning for grandparents to join in with the celebrations between 9.00-11.00am. We are also having a book fair throughout this special Book Week. Children will be visiting the book fair leading up to Book Week and they will be able to purchase books from the book fair before and after school. 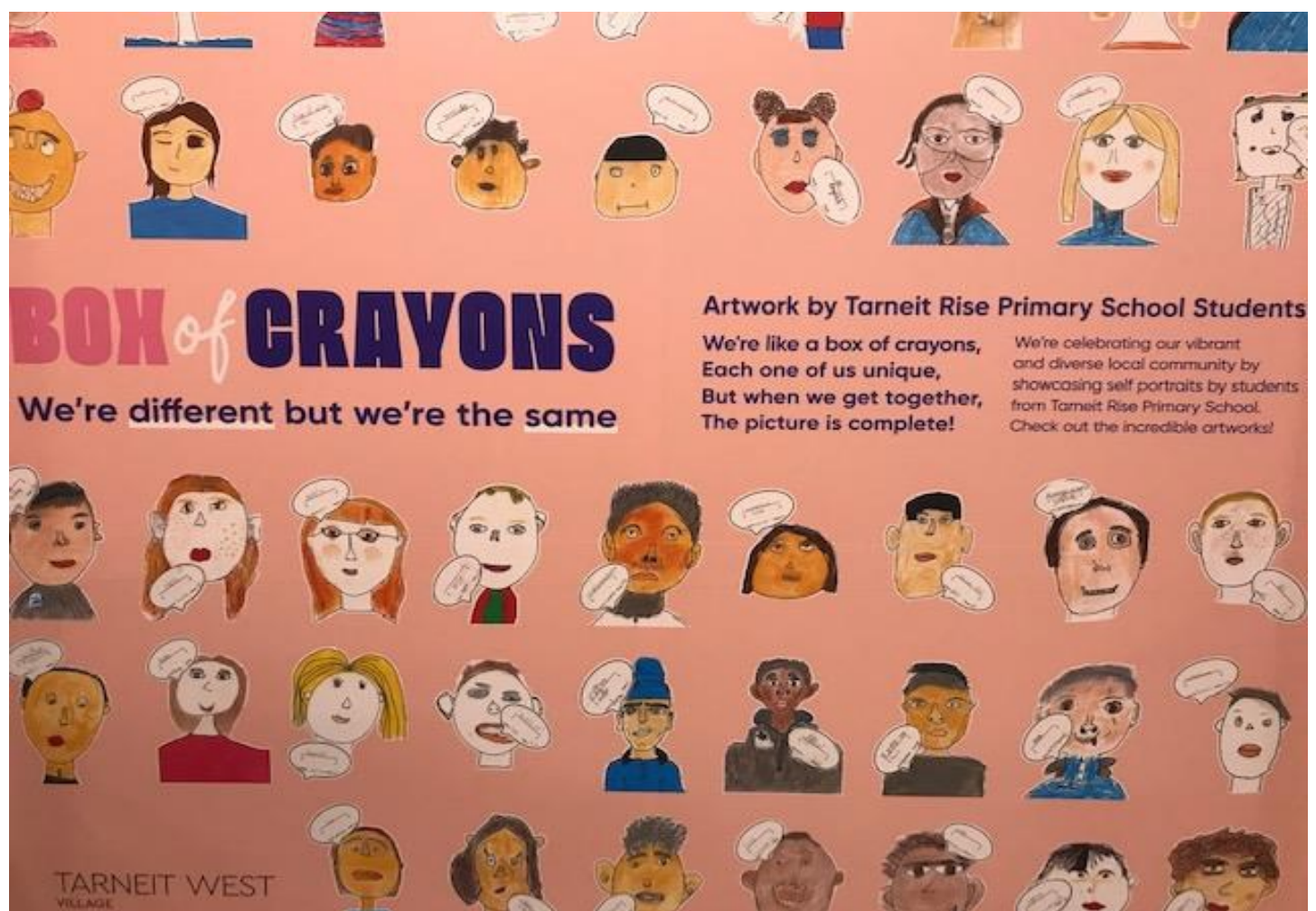
