PARENT COUNCILLORS

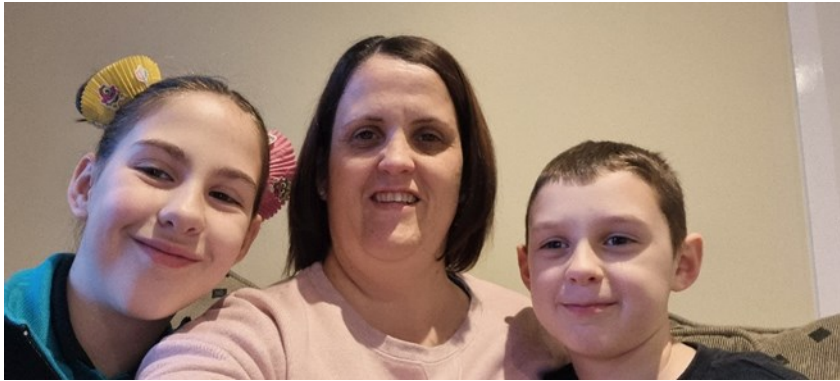
President:

Sarah Narres is one of our Assistant Principals and has been elected to our school council since it's inception.





Samantha Kelly is our School Business Manager. She attends our school council meetings to take minutes but is not herself a member of the council.

BACKGROUND / CONTEXT

Every 10 minutes, an estimated 6000 kilos of textiles and clothing are dumped in landfill in Australia.

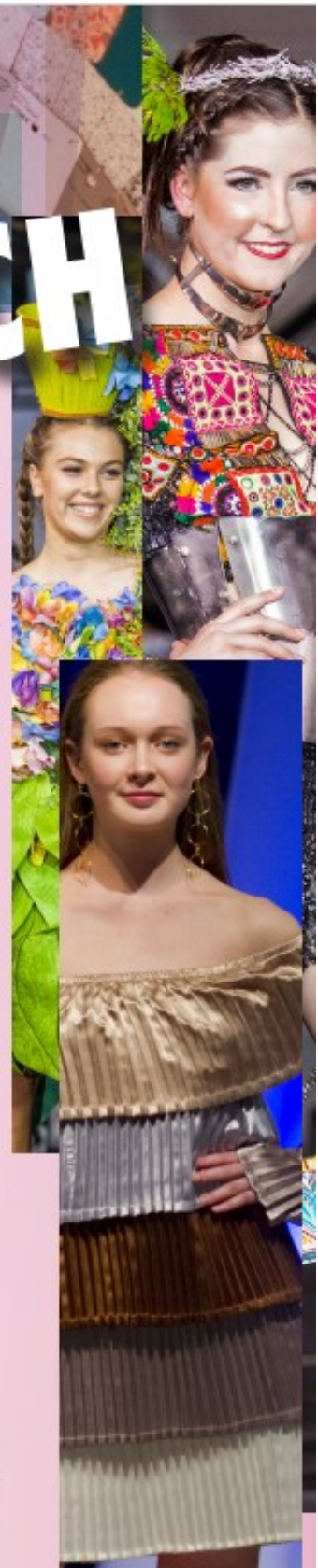
Charities are overwhelmed, only 1% of total collected disposed garments are recycled.

100 billion garments are produced globally each year, with 33% going to landfill within the first year of purchase.

The textile industry is estimated to emit 8% of carbon emission, and 20 % of the World's waste.

Turn your pre-loved garments into new fashion and **SAVE OUR PLANET.**

Looking **GOOD CAN BE BAD FOR THE PLANET.** Massive amounts of chemicals , water and other resources are needed to make fabrics. More than half of the fastest-fashion items made are chucked away within a year of production.

Rags to Riches:

Designers must use 100% pre-worn clothing with zero waste in mind. Can use 2 or 3 outfits to make an exciting new design, new zippers and buttons excepted.

Entries to be submitted via the Fashion Awards Australia website.

Finalist garments will be displayed publicly at Manor Lakes Central and Tarneit Central Shopping Centres.

The judges will expect to see design, cut, and the way you have used the unwanted garments in your design.

SOFT TOYS:

Entrants must use 100% pre-worn clothing or any used fabrics.

Any type of toy accepted.
