Dear parents and caregivers of Tarneit Rise Primary School,

How lovely our children are! It is always such a joy to greet our children in the morning and watch them bound through the gates with their big smiles and twinkling eyes. Their energy is infectious and their eagerness for what the day will bring reminds us of how much can be achieved every day!

A Safe and Healthy Lunchbox

In summer it is so important to follow food safety rules to ensure the food in children's lunch box remains fresh and safe for consumption during the school day. Ways to make sure your children's food in their lunchbox remains fresh and safe include:

- using a lunch box with built-in insulation or freezer packs
- arranging perishable foods such as chicken or egg in between cold items such as freezer packs or frozen water
- disposing of any perishable lunch box leftovers

It is also really, really, important children have a healthy lunchbox because healthy foods contribute to children's alertness and focus during the school day. Did you know the food in children's lunchboxes can make up a third of children's daily food intake, providing the energy they need to get through the busy school day? So, a lunchbox filled with sugary and fatty foods does not provide the required energy or necessary vitamins and minerals for children to retain information and learn. In children's lunchboxes, consider popping in the following foods: fresh fruit, crunchy vegetables, protein foods such as lean meat or hardboiled eggs, cheese sticks or grated cheese, yogurt, sliced bread, a roll, pita bread, flat bread, plain popcorn, crackers and of course water. Consider making the following swaps to children's lunchboxes:

sweetened yogurt for low sugar yogurt or plain, natural yogurt
cake bars and muesli bars for sugar free jelly
muffins and chocolate for fruit bread
chips for fresh or tinned fruit (not in syrup but in juice) or chopped vegetables and dip
biscuits for plain popcorn or rice cakes



External Therapists Delivering Therapy at Tarneit Rise Primary School

For a child's external therapist to work with them whilst they are at school, whether that be to observe them in the classroom or the wider school environment, or to deliver their therapy at school, approval must first be sought from the principal. The principal or their delegate will consider the child's individual circumstances, whether working with their external therapist at school will affect their learning, the safety of all children, and the physical location of where the therapy can take place at the school. If you would like your child's external therapist to work with your child whilst they are at school, the process is:

- 1. the parent and the child's therapist send an email to the school with the request, the type of therapy to be provided, the child's name, and their grade (please DO NOT email the classroom teacher)
- 2. the principal or their delegate decides whether to approve the request and will inform the parent and the child's therapist of the outcome, via email within 48 hours
- 3. if the request is approved, the principal or their delegate will liaise with the therapist, parent/ guardian, and the classroom teacher to discuss the day, time, and location of the therapy
- 4. the parent/ guardian completes the consent to share information form
- 5. the school's office staff will be informed of the therapist's name, the name of the child they are providing therapy for, and the day, time, and location of the therapy.

Please note external therapists will not be permitted onsite if steps one to four of the process have not occurred.

It is the classroom teacher's responsibility to inform the therapist of any occasions when therapy cannot take place due to school activities for example, a school excursion or a whole school event. It is the parent/guardian's responsibility to inform the therapist if the child will be absent the day they receive therapy at school and to inform the school if the therapist is unable to attend, if their child stops receiving therapy, or if there is a change in therapy providers.

- Preps will participate in Bravehearts at the school on Tuesday 07th March.



Dear Prep Families,

Congratulations on what has been an amazing first few days of school. We are so happy with the way our students have settled into the routine of school and are amazed to see their enthusiasm and energy for learning. We are looking forward to the students coming to school 5 days a week starting next Monday the 27th of February. This Wednesday (22/2) all preps will attend.

Learning to Learn

In our Learning to Learn program we are focused on building a strong foundation for your child's academic and social development. In these first few weeks, we have been working on getting to know your child, establishing routines and building a positive classroom culture. We have been engaging in a variety of activities to support your child's learning, including learning how to identify beginning sounds for reading and writing, exploring math concepts and learning about our school values of Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Growth.

Reading

In our Reading program, we have been focusing on listening to a story and identifying key story elements such as the characters, the problem, the character's feelings and the action and solution. Our students are developing these skills to enhance their reading comprehension and overall literacy development.

Writing

In Writing, we have been focusing on a letter and its corresponding sound. So far, we have learnt about the letters "s,a & t". Our students use the strategy of stretching out words and finger spelling to identify beginning sounds. This week, we have also learnt two new heart words, "the & my". We have also had a go at spelling the words and orally putting them into a sentence.

Grade Preps have been working hard at learning the vowels and the letters of the alphabet. Our students love to sing the vowel song and can identify the vowels in their name.

Maths

We have been learning something new each day, such as counting, representing numbers, number formation, subitising, patterns and sorting. Through our Learning to Learn program, we have been establishing positive classroom protocols such as learning how to work with a maths buddy and developing 'partner etiquette' such as sharing, being kind and fair, taking turns and using our manners.

Reading Nights:


Reading nights at home are well underway and our students are working hard to achieve their first 25 Nights of Reading award. Students are only required to bring their satchel to school on their borrowing day. Teachers have allocated one day a week for them to return their books and then they are replenished for the following week. To ensure your child develops good reading habits, make reading at home a part of your afternoon/nightly routine. Reading to your children first, will allow them to listen to the text and have a better understanding of the books they are reading. We also encourage families to have a short conversation about the book by asking questions such as "What was your favourite part of the book?" and making connections about your own personal experiences.














Hello to all our Grade 1 families,

Term 1 is off to a wonderful start and the teachers are amazed at how well our students have settled into another year of learning.

What we are learning:

This fortnight in Reading the Grade 1's have been focusing on Fables and learning to identify the moral of the story. We love watching our students interact with these stories. In Numeracy, the students are working towards building their counting skills by counting to and from 120 starting at different numbers. Students will be reading, writing, representing, and interacting with numbers to 120 in the coming weeks. Noticing numbers in our everyday environment can be fun! We recommend encouraging your child to notice and experiment with numbers in their daily routines. There are many engaging ways to assist in building our number knowledge such as board games, which are a great way to improve our number fluency. We also recommend practicing counting both forwards and backwards from a variety of starting points to help build their number fluency. In Writing, students are continuing their knowledge of letter-sound patterns and learning to write Narratives. We can't wait to showcase some of the grade 1s' amazing writing pieces! In Respectful Relationships, the children are learning about regulating their emotions. This is particularly important for them to revise as students begin a new year and navigate new friendships, routines and class expectations.





Reminders:




Dear Grade 2 Families,

We are proud to see students have settled quickly into their new learning year, forming friendships with new classmates, and following classroom expectations and routines to support their learning.

In Reading, students have been learning to find and determine the main idea in texts they read. Students have embraced the start of our reading to learn unit on Ancient India. With students learning to read and understand maps, comprehend, and answer questions describing ancient Indian civilizations from the class readings. Over the coming week students will learn to locate information in texts on interesting artefacts, the Aryan Ancient Civilisation and learn about Indian gods and their powers.




In Writing, students have been enjoying writing about historical places with a focus on the incredible Taj Mahal. Students went on a 'virtual tour' and wrote interesting facts about the Taj Mahal. Additionally, students are learning how to add and use conjunctions such as 'and, but, because' and 'so' to connect their ideas in writing. Students will be practising how to use and place commas correctly and write descriptions including details of who, what, when, where, why and how to improve their writing.







In Maths, students have been investigating and using number sequences by skip counting by 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s from any starting number. Students have been learning to skip count by ascending (going up) order and by descending order (going down) their number charts. Students will be learning to recognise skip counting patterns and fill in any missing parts to the pattern.



In Vocabulary, our word focus are words connected to student voice and the school values. Students do word activities throughout the week to enhance their listening, speaking, reading and writing. Our words for Week 3 were respect, kindness, responsibility, growth, and trust. Our words for Week 4 are environment, underpinned, offer, realistic, suggestions, accept and impact.


In History, students have been exploring what past, present and future means. Students will be comparing their families past and present life by creating some questions to take home and ask their families. They will be using the answers to these questions to compare and contrast how things may have changed over time.

We look forward to continuing the fantastic learning over the next two weeks and are excited to meet our Grade 2 families and the Meet and Greet.

In Reading, the Grade 3s have begun learning about world rivers and how they are important in our lives. Students are practising how to identify literal information and how to summarise the main ideas from a text. They are learning about how rivers can be used as a water source to sustain life. They have also explored how farmers use river water to irrigate their crops. In the coming weeks, they will continue to learn about how rivers make our lives better and take a closer look at our very own Murray River.

In Writing, students have been practising their narrative writing. The Grade 3s have reviewed the structure of a narrative through 'Story Grammar' - the necessary parts that make up a narrative. We have been unpacking existing narratives and have started to create our own plans. So far, students have been sharing their amazing ideas for their stories' characters, settings, problems, character feelings and plans. In future, students will look at how to close a narrative and practise drafting their plans into complete texts, with a focus on paragraphing, sentence structure and language features.


In Maths, the Grade 3s have been learning about data. Students have been learning about the different ways of collecting data through *observation* (observing with your sight) or *survey* (asking a question). In addition to data collection, students have been learning about appropriate questions to ask in order to collect data, as well as effective ways to display their information. They have created graphs including tally graphs, pictographs, column graphs and pie graphs. Following data, Grade 3s will be delving into place value.

In Vocabulary, students are learning about the meanings of words that will help them understand the definition of 'student voice'. This week's target words are *environment*, *underpinned*, *offer*, *realistic*, *suggestions*, *accept* and *impact*. Students are building on their understanding of these words through fun word association activities and by exploring their synonyms and antonyms. We encourage families to purposely use our weekly target words to promote our students' reading, writing and oral language.

In our content lessons, students have been learning about ethics - their knowledge of right and wrong. Grade 3s have explored what ethics mean and how people can form different opinions, depending on the situation. Students were presented with various scenarios that required them to engage in critical thinking. In small groups, they explored the actions they could take when faced with a certain scenario, and the consequences their actions would have.


Reminders:

- Every student has received a journal to record their nightly reading in. Please ensure that your child completes this and returns it to school on the day that their teacher has requested. It is a school expectation that the children read for at least 20 minutes every day.

READING

During reading, the year 4's have been practising their literal and inferential comprehension through our Reading 2 Learn unit on Dynasties of China. The students are really enjoying increasing their knowledge about Ancient China to better understand this terms serial text 'Dragon Keeper' by Carole Wilkinson. This week's vocabulary words have also been taken from Dragon Keeper.





WRITING

We are exploring note taking. We need to be able to take notes as it helps us boost comprehension, absorb information faster and makes it easier to create non fiction texts.

MATHS


We have started our unit on place value. In week 3, students explored the connection between number properties and the four operations. During week 4 we are moving into recognising and representing numbers into the tens of thousands and comparing and ordering numbers in the tens of thousands.

It's been an action packed start to the term in PLC Five. The students have completed their Learn2Learn program and are now well into our curriculum delivery. Well done to Karthi in 5H who won the first Principal's Award of the year, for always displaying the school values, particularly when showing kindness to his peers.

Reading

In Reading, the students have begun their Read2Learn program, 'The Age of Exploration'. During the first two weeks of this unit, the students have been learning about the Spice Trade and the pioneering Portuguese explorers journeys around Africa and to India. In addition to this, the students have also started their small group guided and reciprocal reading as well as literature circles.

Vocabulary

Over the past two weeks the students have been learning new vocabulary related to the school values. The students have also been introduced to 'Word Wizard' which encourages them to recognise the new vocabulary when reading, include the words in their writing and also when speaking.

Writing


We have been looking at how to write persuasive texts in our Write2Learn program. Students have been focussing on the use of transitional words to help their writing flow, as well as how our language choices can influence how persuasive our writing is. We have been learning how to use the opposing side of an argument as a counter to our own so that we are acknowledging multiple perspectives.

Mathematics

We are now well into our unit on Place Value. So far students have been learning how to represent numbers to the hundreds of thousands. Students have been saying the numbers out loud, writing the numbers using words and representing numbers in their expanded form using expanded notation. We are currently working on ordering and comparing numbers and ways in which we can demonstrate how one number is larger or smaller than another.

- NAPLAN is fast approaching and will be held during Week 7.
- School diaries have now been sent home, it is an expectation that all students are reading regularly throughout the week and recording this in their diaries.



The term is racing by, with 4 weeks already finished! We have continued to be impressed by the way our grade sixes have started the school year, showing enthusiasm for learning and making every learning minute count. We have been working hard to set learning goals with the students, and are excited to share these with you at the **Meet and Greet** on **Thursday 2nd of March**. Reading

To complement our Geography learning, the students have been exploring 'Feudal Japan' in their reading sessions. They have explored the influence Korea and China has had on Japan, as well as Japan's diverse characteristics and location. Students have practised the skills of interpreting maps, finding information within the text and answering questions about the text.



European traders and missionaries brought new weapons and ideas to Japan.

Writing

In preparation for students beginning their 'biography' writing next week, students have been revising the structure of a paragraph. They have used example paragraphs to annotate and identify the topic sentence, supporting detail sentences and concluding sentences. Students have also looked at 'illustrative transition' words, to look at ways writers give evidence in their writing.

Maths

In maths, students have been investigating prime and composite numbers. The beginning of the year has also been a chance to revise strategies that students can use when solving problems using the four operations. Students were prompted in their warm-ups to use the correct maths vocabulary and talk through their chosen strategy for solving the problem.

| Grade Prep:

Our preps are starting to get to know the routines and expectations in the art room. Last week, they completed a guided drawing of a cartoon apple, while demonstrating the expectations. This line work will form the background for a self portrait that they will be working on soon.





Grade 1 & 2:

Last week, the grade 1s and 2s focused on the elements of **colour** and **line**. Grade 1s learnt about primary colours and grade 2s learnt about secondary colours. Both year levels completed landscape drawings, focusing on using different types of lines to complete the drawing. They also filled all areas using lines in their focus colours.










Grade 3 & 4:


The grade 3 and 4 students have been focusing on using graphite pencils to show different drawing techniques. In week 2, they completed a guided drawing of a landscape and in week 3, they completed a still life observational drawing. Students practiced with shading and blending to add depth and form to their work.





Grade 5 & 6:

In week 2, the grade 5 and 6 students learnt about different shading techniques including blending, hatching, cross-hatching, stippling and scumbling. In week 3, they completed an observational drawing of sports equipment, using the techniques they learnt.

What a fantastic first few weeks back at school we have had! Battling hot conditions, new learning and lots of testing, the students have been resilient and demonstrated our school values of Respect, Responsibility, Kindness, and Growth amazingly in all Physical Education lessons. Keep up the great work TRPS.

Curriculum:

Preps:

We have been learning about the fundamental movement skills in Physical Education. Our Prep's have learnt lots about our 'Magic Shoebox' and the diverse shoes (Skipping, Backwards, Frog and Crab shoes) that we use to move around designated areas! It has been amazing to see the development of movement within such a short period of time. We have also focused on running techniques and how to move safely in a small area, and how to run faster in a larger area.

Grade 1-2's:

In Grade 1/2 we have focused on performing different locomotor skills successfully within a short period of time. The students have been part taking in a Fundamental Movement skills test that measures how accurately and quickly we can change direct, technique and movement in a designated area. Over the next week we will be working on diverse running drills to focus on our movement techniques and to continue to build our understanding of locomotion.

Grade 3-4's:

In Grade 3/4 we have been working on Net and Wall games, focusing on the offensive and defensive strategies, as well as identifying space on a court to score and defend points, through learning about and playing four square and down ball. We will continue working on Net and Wall games for another couple of weeks, by exploring different games, and their strategies.

Grade 5-6's:

This week we have focused on the sport Badminton, as we are building our defensive and offensive knowledge and skills. We have worked on our forehand and backhand techniques by alternating the racquet and playing shots. Strategically the kids have learnt about how to draw their opponent away from the middle of the court, and using the angles of the court to offensively score points.



Student Milestones:

Congratulations to Shaurya who represented the Western Region U12 team for the VMCU; his team were the winner of the Josh Brown plate for WRJCA representative team. Shaurya was selected as top order batter and opened the innings for his team, he also scored 66 in the first match.

This year in Performing Arts, Grade 1-6 students are learning about dance and music. Prep students will be learning all three strands of Performing Arts: dance, music and drama.





Hello,

We all were so amazed to see all our TRPS students settling into their new grades and routine so well.

Last week Prep students learned about day and night sky features and they showed their understanding by making a picture in an app called Scratch jr. This week are learning to use identify and describe different weather such as overcast, stormy, snowy, or sunny.
